SELECTION OF GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES

Different degrees have different General Education requirements. General Education courses are taken during a student's **first 2 years of university** studies, as most are prerequisites for high level coursework. ACS offers Broward College's General Education courses in order to fulfill the transfer requirements for most universities.

CORE COURSES

Core courses are classes that every student seeking to obtain a particular degree is required to take in order to graduate in his/her field of study.

General Education Requirements for Associate of Arts Degree:

- International/Intercultural requirement (I) (1 course).
- Civic Literacy Students should complete either POS2041 American Government or AMH2020 Introductory Survey since 1877.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CAN EARN A U.S. DIPLOMA FROM A RECOGNIZED, FULLY ACCREDITED U.S. HIGH SCHOOL.

The American College High School program allows students to complete their high school studies and obtain a high school diploma, which is fully accredited in the U.S.

Each student applying to the high school program will be advised on an individual basis. Students transferring from other schools will have their previous coursework evaluated and will be assigned the necessary courses for high school completion.

With a tailor-made program, classes are taught by a team of qualified teachers specialized in different subjects. We offer personal academic advice to all students, national and international, and from all levels of study.

The high school program at The American College in Spain has been carefully developed to create a high-quality, rigorous education. In order to ensure that courses meet the national academic content standards, students follow the college path diploma requirements.

- Electives 3 units.

Students attending The American College in Spain High School Program are simultaneously registered in one of our partner schools. Upon completion, students will receive an accredited High School Diploma that meets university admissions standards.




COURSES

COURSE DEVELOPMENT

Our high school courses are carefully developed to create a high-quality, rigorous education. Courses meet the national academic content standards and state academic standards for all core subject matter areas—English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.

Students wishing to continue their education at a university should follow the university-prep curriculum. These courses involve more writing assignments to prepare students for the writing skills expected at the post-secondary level. The course sequencing of the university-prep curriculum meets minimum admissions requirements of most colleges and universities and includes NCAA-approved core courses.

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UNIVERSITY PREPARATORY PROGRAM

Students wishing to continue their education at a college or university should consider enrolling in courses that follow the university preparatory program of study. While different colleges and universities may have different requirements, our program offers courses that meet these requirements.

We do, however, advise that students who are about to graduate visit with an admissions officer at their college or university of choice to be sure of what courses are needed to fulfill admission requirements.



STANDARD DIPLOMA PROGRAM

Students preparing for vocational or technical school, work, military, or other non-university plans may consider following the standard diploma program, which includes some required courses and several opportunities for individual selection.

Students wishing to continue their education in the United States may have to fulfill certain requirements. Most universities may require the following for admission:

*Most colleges and universities require 2 units of the same World Language that is not the student's native language. The American College High School program follows this standard when creating graduation plans for college-bound students.

**For students following Mizzou Academy academic program, The State of Missouri requires that students pass a Missouri State Exam in order to meet core competency skill requirements in history. Successful completion of U.S. Government will meet this state requirement.

Hecreditation AND APPROVALS

Both Mizzou Academy and UNHS are diploma awarding schools. Upon completion of graduation requirements, students will earn a high school diploma that is respected and accepted by colleges and universities worldwide.

NCAA APPROVED

Most High School core courses are approved by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), allowing students to earn the credits they need to meet initial eligibility requirements.

The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the well-being and lifelong success of college athletes. The main purpose of the NCAA is to govern competition in a fair, safe, equitable, and sportsmanlike manner, and to integrate intercollegiate athletics into higher education so that the educational experience of the student-athlete is paramount.

Student-athletes who wish to attend university will need to build a foundation of high school courses to prepare them for college coursework. Students who plan to compete in NCAA sports at Division I or II schools must pass a certain number of NCAA core courses.

START STRONG

9TH GRADE

In the United States, ninth grade is usually the first year in high school (called "upper secondary school" in other countries). In this system, ninth graders are also often referred to as freshmen. It can also be the last year of junior high school. The typical age for U.S. 9th grade students is 14 to 15 years.



CONDITION

10TH GRADE

The tenth grade is the tenth school year. Grade 10 is a part of high school, and in most parts of the U.S. it is the second year of high school, with 11th then 12th following.



BUILD STRENGHT

11TH GRADE

In the US, a student in the eleventh grade is typically referred to as a student in the eleventh grade or as a junior. Math students usually take Algebra II, but classes like Trigonometry or Precalculus are sometimes offered for students who wish to take Advanced Placement math classes in their fourth, or senior year of high school.



STRONG FINISH

12TH GRADE

The twelfth grade is the twelfth school year. It is also the last year of compulsory secondary education, or "high school". Students are often 17–18 years old. Twelfth graders are referred to as Seniors.

GED

The GED (General Educational Development) is a High School proficiency test that evaluates 4 areas of the student's knowledge: Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematical Reasoning. It consists of a series of 4 tests that once passed demonstrates that the student meets the necessary requirements of a high school education in the United States of America. Once completed, the student will receive a GED diploma.

The GED is an interesting and highly recommended option for those students who have not completed their secondary-level studies and want access to a U.S. university in order to obtain a university degree. Most U.S. universities accept students with a GED diploma. The GED® credential is accepted by over 97% of colleges and employers.

Since May 2017, the new GED test has been available internationally.

Benefits of the new International GED program:

- A test that more fully measures critical thinking and reasoning skills, and is aligned with the most current U.S. education standards. Two new scoring levels, College-ready and College-ready + Credit will allow students on the high end of the achievement spectrum to demonstrate their achievements to post-secondary institutions.

PRE-GED

The Pre- Ged is a preparatory course aimed at helping students enter the GED program. It focuses on raising students' English language, writing and mathematical skills.

SAT

The SAT is an exam that is used to apply and gain access to universities in the United States of America. The exam is designed to determine how prepared the student is to enter the university. It evaluates knowledge in reading comprehension, writing, and mathematics. A student's SAT score will be taken into account by the universities during the admission process.

The American College in Spain offers a preparatory course for the SAT. This course teaches the students the necessary skills required to pass the SAT exam.

TOEFL

The TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) exam is the most widely used academic English proficiency test in the world. Thousands of colleges and universities use the TOEFL to test and evaluate the English

language competency of their students and academic personnel.

The TOEFL test measures English language proficiency in these three disciplines: reading, speaking, listening and writing (four skills).

ACADEMIC ENGLISH

Academic English is a program that has been developed to allow students to obtain an appropriate and sufficient level of English so that they are able to receive a formal education that is taught in this language. The program is adapted to the student's level and maintains reading, writing, grammar and conversation as its main pillars.

Upon completing the program (level 4), the student will have reached the level necessary to comfortably pursue a degree that is taught in English.

SPANISH PROGRAM

The Spanish Program offered at ACS has different levels, each of which is specifically designed to meet the students' needs.
